 A career in real estate revealed the subtle effects of supply and demand, public involvement and private financing on the housing market. The county has entities in place that have requested support to pursue solving the workforce housing concern. They should have the opportunity to reach these goals. Private developers should also have opportunities to satisfy this need. I will describe a few things that will facilitate this growth. One, the fewer restrictions, the better it is for private development. Two, cooperation and not competition between private and public projects is vital. Three, as an educator, I am reminded of the need for data to guide our decisions. With that in mind, we need a usable metric to measure the effectiveness of any of these quests for workforce housing.
