INFRASTRUCTURE

Chaffee County has always played host to one of the busiest corridors of Colorado. Bisected by Highways 50 and 285, the county sits at an economic crossroads, which serves the larger intermountain region. Scenic Highway 24 provides quick access to the I-70 corridor. Two airports serve the area.

The county offers high speed and reliable Internet services, with fully redundant backbone services and multiple last mile ISPs. To serve our workforce, Buena Vista is home to a campus of Colorado Mountain College, ranked 17th in the nation by CNN/Money in 2013.

Stewardship of county resources remains a priority. Salida is completing a new stateof-the-art wastewater treatment plant. A privately run residential drop-off and commercial pickup recycling company serves the county. Our downtown areas embrace mixed use, including Buena Vista's South Main development, which provides living, office and retail space while preserving open space on the banks of the Arkansas River.
