
## **Chaffee County 2020 Update and Outlook**

- Chaffee County's population rose to 20,024 in 2018, up 392 or 2.0% from 2017. Over the past 3 years (2016-18), the county's population is up 1,432 or 2.5% per year. In the first half of the decade from 2010 to 2015, the county's population increased by 800 or 0.9% per year.
- Since 2010, Chaffee County's population has grown by 2,225 due to a net migration gain
  of 2,525 and a natural decrease of 300 (1,100 births less 1,400 deaths). Deaths have
  exceeded births since 2005; SDO projections show this natural decline trend continuing
  into the future due to the aging of the county's resident, and the small share of women
  of childbearing age, meaning all future growth will be due to migration.
- Chaffee County is the 10<sup>th</sup> oldest county in Colorado in the state in terms of share of the population over the age of 65 at 25% (vs. 14% in Colorado) and the 12<sup>th</sup> oldest in terms of median age at 47.8 years in 2018.
- The Buena Vista Correctional Facility is the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest employer in Chaffee County, accounting for approximately 4% of all covered employment and 7% of total wages (Fed/State Gov ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in base employment). With an inmate population of 1,250, the prison accounts for just over 6% of the countywide population. Criminal justice and sentencing reform has the potential to cause a decline in both the number of jobs and group quarter's population in Chaffee. Additionally, 54% of inmates in Colorado Correctional system are between the ages of 18-39, increasing the number of county residents under the age of 65 and bringing down the median age. If one only looks at the household population, then Chaffee becomes older than the figures cited above.
- Given that ¼ of Chaffee's population is over the age of 65, the pensions, savings and other income of this "Retiree" population is the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest economic driver in the county accounting for roughly 27% of the outside dollars coming into the community.
- Anchored by the Heart of the Rockies Medical Center, Health Care & Social Assistance accounts for just over 1,000 of the 8,083 jobs in the county. Regional services are the 3<sup>rd</sup> largest economic driver in Chaffee at 16% and nearly 60% of this is attributable to Education & Health Services.
- Tourism is largest economic driver in the county, with the Leisure & Hospitality industry accounting for 2,057 jobs (25% of total) in 2018. Tourism accounts for 33% of the base industry in Chaffee as 2<sup>nd</sup> homes and services for tourism are included in this analysis. Tourism faces a number of headwinds. Near-term, the COVID-19 virus poses the largest threat as international tourism has declined; if the outbreak spreads throughout Colorado and the U.S. it could result in a decline in hotel and restaurant visits and lead people to avoid or cancel large gatherings such as summer festivals and concerts. Longer-run threats include the aging of the Colorado and U.S. populations leading to a

- decline in the number of participants in outdoor recreation (i.e. camping, biking, skiing & rafting). Climate change is also a threat to tourism, with wide ranging impacts from forest fires, droughts, increasing temperatures, and extreme weather events threatening to decrease the number of skiable and raftable days in Chaffee County.
- Chaffee County's population is projected to grow to 22,929 by 2030, representing an increase of nearly 2,500 from 2020's projected population of 20,450. Unlike the past decade where the 65+ population accounted for nearly 70% of the growth, the under 65 population is expected to account for 65% of the population increase between now and 2030. In addition to being younger, the population expected to move into Chaffee over this upcoming decade is expected to be much more diverse because Colorado's younger population is more diverse. Projections show the Hispanic Population in Chaffee growing by 50% over the next decade, increasing from 2,201 in 2018 (10.9% of the population) to 3,301 (14.4% of the population) in 2030.
- The population growth forecast is predicated on the assumption that the economy in Chaffee County continues to grow and diversify its economy and not lose any major employers over the next decade. Tourism is projected to see little growth over the next decade, while retiree generated jobs are expected to grow into the largest economic driver in the County by 2030.
- Chaffee will have to add nearly 1,000 houses to its occupied residential housing stock over the next decade to accommodate this projected growth – this can be done either through new construction or converting a portion of the vacant, seasonally occupied (i.e. 2<sup>nd</sup> or vacation homes) into homes that are occupied year round.
- The employment and population forecast is based almost entirely on national, state and regional variables that look at population changes, employment growth by industry and other economic factors. No local constraints such as zoning, land owned by the Federal or State Government limiting possible uses, or water availability are taken into account in the projections; however, planning department build out estimates provided to the SDO by counties are used as a control for the number of housing units when available.




